What is Birth to Age 8?



An intentional initiative that brings essential partners & services together to assure children reach key developmental milestones from birth to age 8.

Why is this needed?

Research tells us that if children are reading proficiently by third grade, they are more likely to graduate high school and achieve greater economic success and socioeconomic mobility and stability. It emphasizes the importance of improving academic readiness and outcomes early in life, and breaking the cycle of poverty through greater educational attainment.

- School staff from four local school districts
- 360 Communities
- Community Action Partnership/Head Start
- Dakota County Public Health, and Children and Family Services

How will we make a difference?

- Track children's developmental milestones during critical early years - ensure school readiness and reading at grade level by age 8
- Early identification of those children who face challenges to healthy development and potential school success
- Connect and surround families with supports, as needed, that improve children's school success
- Children meeting the state proficiency reading target by spring of third grade

Portal collaboration with schools

- Received \$200k from Legislature to build the portal
- Built on top of PH-Doc system (EHR)
- Currently in phase 2 of development
- Allows us to share and collaborate intentionally - with participating schools

Portal Data Elements

From Public Health

- Birth certificate data, income data, referral data
- Ages and Stages
 Questionnaire (ASQ)
- Ages and Stages
 Questionnaire-Social
 Emotional (ASQ-SE)

From the Schools

- Early Childhood Screening
- Kindergarten Readiness
 Data
- 1st, 2nd, 3rd grade reading scores
- Referral & intervention data

Portal Features

- DIRECT Mail (Inpriva) for communications
- Customizable security settings & notifications
- Enrollment & Benchmark Data uploads for schools
- Outreach tracking
- Downloadable data for schools

Workflows

 Engage end-users in initial design to ensure operational aspects are in place to carry out the work



- Staff assigned to various pieces
- Capacity of staff and systems
- Flow of information and resources

Joint Powers Agreement

- JPA chosen over a Memorandum of Understanding or Data Sharing Agreement due to the partnership and need for governance
- Includes:
 - Rights and obligations for the County and school district partners
 - Outlines compliance with laws
 - Data practices

Consent

- County portion needs to comply with Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, HIPAA
- Schools need to comply with FERPA
- Two signatures needed; one document
- Annual renewal, opt-out
- Care coordination as separate consent

Timeline of development



Down the road

- All Dakota County School Districts on B28
- Web Scripts will be shared with all PH-Doc users
- Two additional health departments adopt B28 by 2021
- Look at other partners (e.g. nonprofits, medical)
- Continue to enhance the portal
