

## You Can Make a Difference!



- Legislators measure public support on an issue by the number of calls and letters they receive.
- How many calls/letters does it take to make a difference?



On Friday, November 12, NAMI member Sam Smith conducted a presentation to RCLLG members on how to effectively select an issue or issues and advocate for them at the legislature. One of the goals of RCLLG's collective action workgroup is to identify an issue for RCLLG to advocate for during next year's legislative session, and this training will not only will assist in that goal, but will benefit anyone who wants to better advocate for their cities, schools, and organizations.

### **Meeting Summary**

#### **The Legislative Process**

NAMI Policy Director Sam Smith began the advocacy training with an overview of the legislative process. The process is as follows:

#### **Process:**

- 1. Idea
- 2. Bill Introduced
- 3. Funding Committee
- 4. Full Floor
- 5. Other Side
- 6. Conference Committee
- 7. To the Governor.

At NAMI, they find that it takes **3 unique contacts** from a constituent to meaningfully change their perspective on an issue.

#### **How to Advocate**

- Know who represents you and what committees they serve on. Have their contact info.
- Only contact your legislators.
- Be nice. Never threaten, insult, or say you won't vote for someone.
- Always state what group you are with and who you are.
- You don't need to be an expert –
  just tell your story. Real stories
  change minds.
- Don't be afraid if you don't know the answers to their questions. What's most important

is that you've shown interest.
